PROGRAM HIGHLIGHT "ONE OF A KIND" CLOTHING

Each fall and spring, Tomchei LA's "One of a Kind" clothing program sets up a temporary retail store filled with brand new, contemporary clothing. We receive the clothing directly from the manufacturers at extremely discounted prices or at no cost. We provide clothing specified for men, women, teens, girls, boys, toddlers and infants at nominal prices. All recipients shop by appointment only, with the assistance of volunteer personal shoppers.

NUMBERS FROM THE YEAR

2,900 individuals receive brand new clothing twice a year

420 families assisted

3.700 ladies and girls tops

1,800 ladies and girls skirts and dresses

1,100 men's and boys suits

1,200 men's and boys shirts

400 pairs of brand new children's shoes

Q&A WITH "ONE OF A KIND" VOLUNTEER DIRECTOR, ROCHEL HABERMAN

How long have you been volunteering for Tomchei LA's "One of a Kind" clothing program? I have been volunteering for about ten years.

What inspired you to join the "One of a Kind" team?

My mother had been volunteering for a few years prior and inspired me by her dedication and commitment to the program. The stories I heard and the work I witnessed made me want to be a part of this incredible program.

What's the hardest part about volunteering?

The hardest part is seeing the great needs of people and wishing we could give and do more. It somehow feels like it is still not enough.

How does "One of a Kind" purchase the clothing and set it up, and then how do you select individuals in our community to receive it?

The process involves a whole team of volunteers. We travel twice a year to the east coast to source wholesalers, companies and factories who sell us brand new clothing at exceptional discounts. It's amazing how kind and eager clothing companies are to sell to us, even at a loss, to be a part of this cause. Once the clothing is shipped and arrives at the warehouse we have teams of volunteers working hard to unpack, hang, sort and size the clothing. It is a massive undertaking that takes months of organization. In order to qualify, recipients must fill out an application that is reviewed by the staff.

What's the most rewarding part of your volunteer job?

Witnessing the confidence unfold in front of your eyes as a teenager tries on a new dress and not only feels amazing in it, but also feels the same as all of her friends who are getting something new for the holidays. Something new that is in style and looks like she bought it in a retail store. Hearing the mother's audible sighs of relief that the kids are outfitted for the holidays and are happy and love their "purchases" without feeling stressed by the expense and the experience.

What's an inspiring moment that you've experienced during your time as a volunteer?

Almost every moment as a volunteer can be inspiring since you are constantly seeing new families come in to get clothes and walk out with full bags and smiles on their faces and weights off their shoulders. One particular story sticks out in my mind when a friend called me asking me if I knew where this store "One of a Kind" was located because her daughter was begging her to take her shopping there since all her friends had the nicest and most stylish clothes from this "store." It was obviously not something I could help her daughter with other than refer her to the local retail stores, but it was a great feeling to hear that kids were so excited and happy with their clothes that they were even sharing it with their friends and did not feel awkward about it. The highest form of helping others is to not make people feel like they're being helped.

Why should other people donate their time to help volunteer for "One of a Kind?"

There is always work to be done and there are always more funds needed as our budget is continuously growing as there are more families invited every season. There are also so many more things we could be adding to what we give. We just haven't had enough funds to include things that right now are considered "extras" like shoes, pajamas and other every day clothing items, which are basic needs.

Why should people donate to "One of a Kind?"

Every dollar donated goes directly to funding clothing for families and restoring dignity, confidence, and self-respect. Everyone who can donate should know that it is an incredible honor to be a part of this program and their funds are going to people directly in their synagogues, schools and communities.

What does getting new clothing mean to you and why is it so important for people to help people with their clothes?

New clothing is tied to the way a person feels about themselves and what they want to project about themselves. It's important to give families the ability to feel good about how they look, to wear clothes that suit them and fit them properly and mostly give them something to be joyful and excited about during the holidays which is a very financially stressful time for most families.

RUTHIE GRAMMA


